Terebra carnicolor, sp. nov.

Shell subulate, pale flesh colour, polished, shining; remaining whorls 15, sculptured with closely set longitudinal costae, crossed near the upper end by a slight spiral groove, thus forming an infra-sutural crenate band; the interstices between the costae spirally punctate, the punctations of the upper row being coarser than the rest; aperture small, narrow; columella descending rather obliquely; peristome simple; base of shell marked with three revolving punctate grooves.
