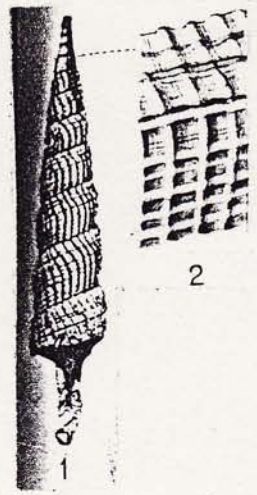

Terebra hitia n. sp.

The shell is very slender, with slightly convex whorls. Sculpture of many narrow axial riblets, narrower than their intervals, retractive above, vertical in the lower two-thirds. Below the suture there are two spiral cords under the ribs, followed by a deeper sulcus and then a prominent spiral, below which there are about 6 spiral cords, unequally spaced, with some small spiral striæ in the widest space. The last whorl is largely broken away. The columella shows one very low, rounded plait.

Length 24, diam. 5 mm.; 11½ whorls remaining.
