

## Terebra (Myurella) oldhami Vredenburg.

1921. Terebra (Myurella) oldhami Vredenburg, Rec. Geol. Surv. Ind., LI, pt. 4, p. 352, Pl. X, fig. 16.

Material.—Three specimens (K24/269).

Distribution.—Kama stage (Lower Miocene) of Burma.

Remarks.—The type of this species is much eroded and has somewhat broader spiral lines than those of the Quilon specimens. Vredenburg regards the species as an ancestral form of the large Terebra stearnsii Pilsbry, from Japan. Terebra cumingii Desh., has a somewhat different sutural band and fewer spiral lines.
