



Terebra (Euryta) angasi Tryon, 1885, Man. Conch. 7: 38, pl. 12, figs. 25, 26. This is a synonym of Parviterebra brazieri (Angas, 1875), family Columbellidae. (Exc.) Br 87

T. Angasi, Tryon. Pl. 12, figs. 25, 26. (p38)

Olivelliform, with small, rather close plications, disappearing on the upper part of the body-whorl; whitish, shining, with three fulvous bands upon which are longitudinal light chestnut zigzag markings. Length, 10-12 mill.

Rapid Bay, So. Australia; N. S. Wales.

Described by Adams and Angas under the name of Euryta pulchella, preoccupied in Terebra by Deshayes. T. Brazieri, Angas (fig. 26), appears to be only a slightly differently colored 7. full-hall a advalue specimen. Angas has himself preoccupied this specific name in Terebra.
